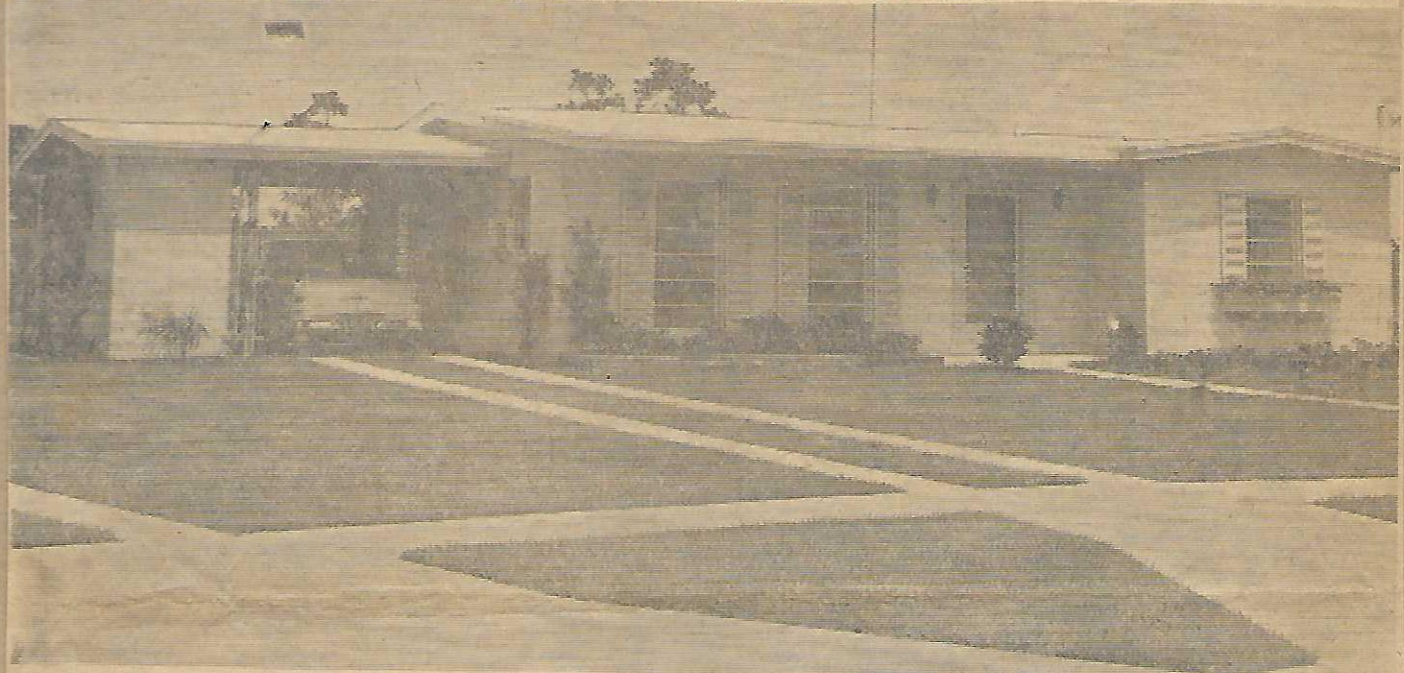

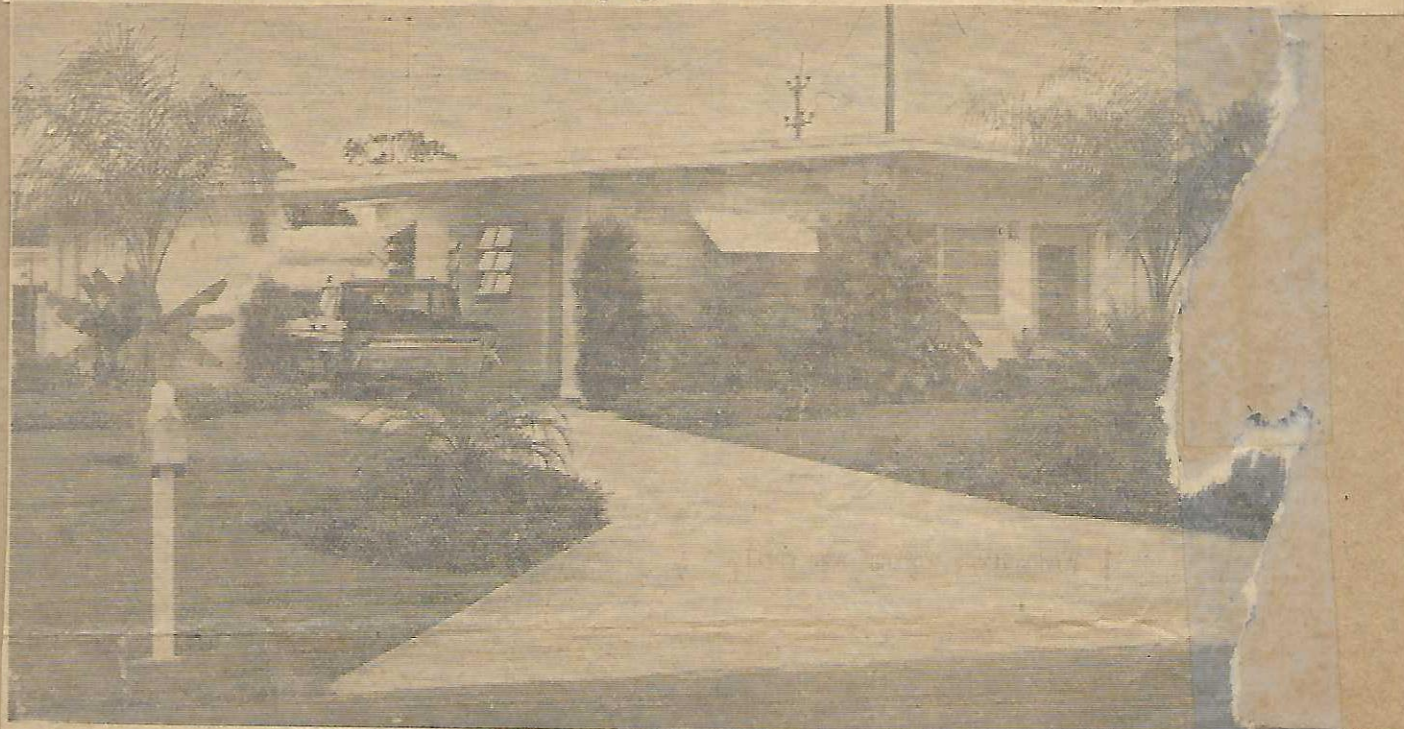
Another \$50 cash award put up by General Development Corp. in cooperation with the Rio Lindo Garden Club, went to Mr. and Mrs. Don Gutelius of

Mr. and Mrs. Willis F. Brothers of 134 Estia Lane won a \$50 first place prize in overall landscaping,

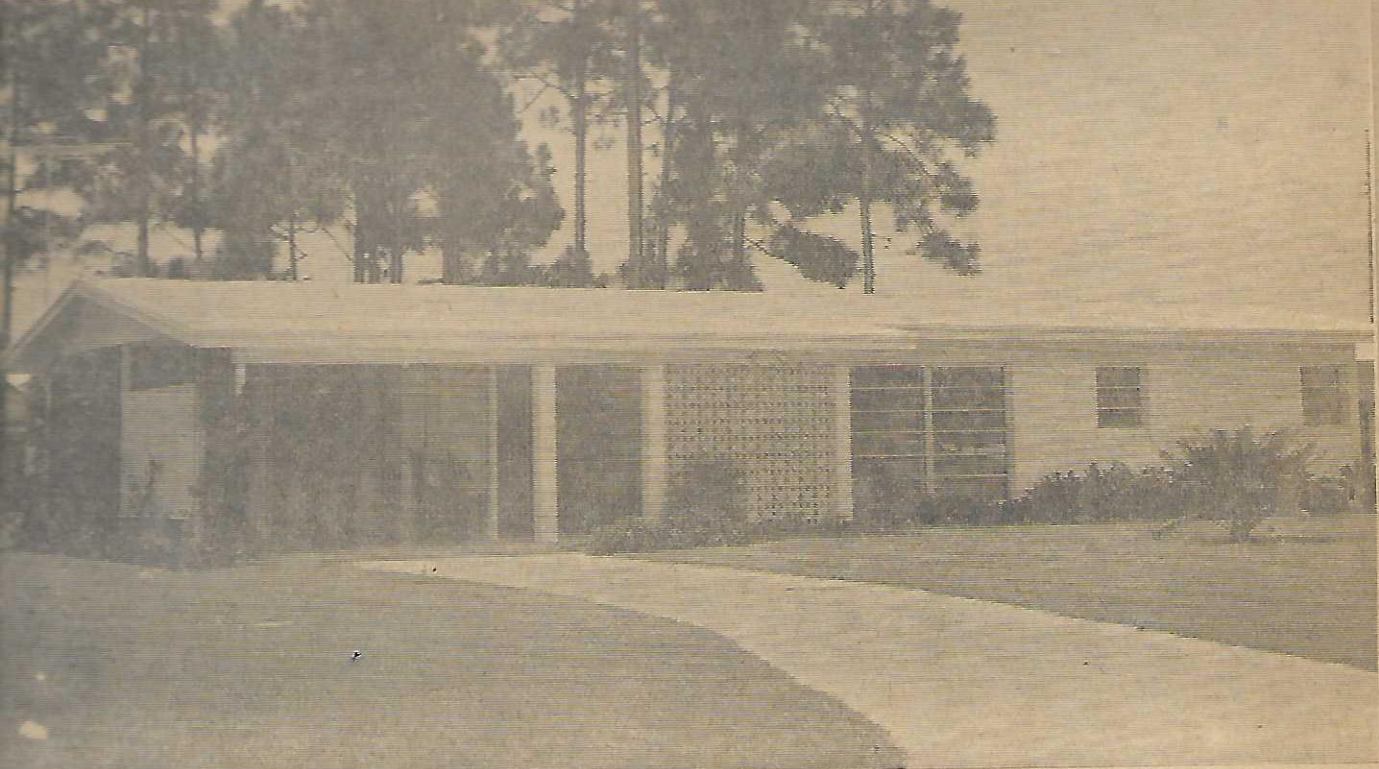
Class II. Notice the neat, trim shrubs.

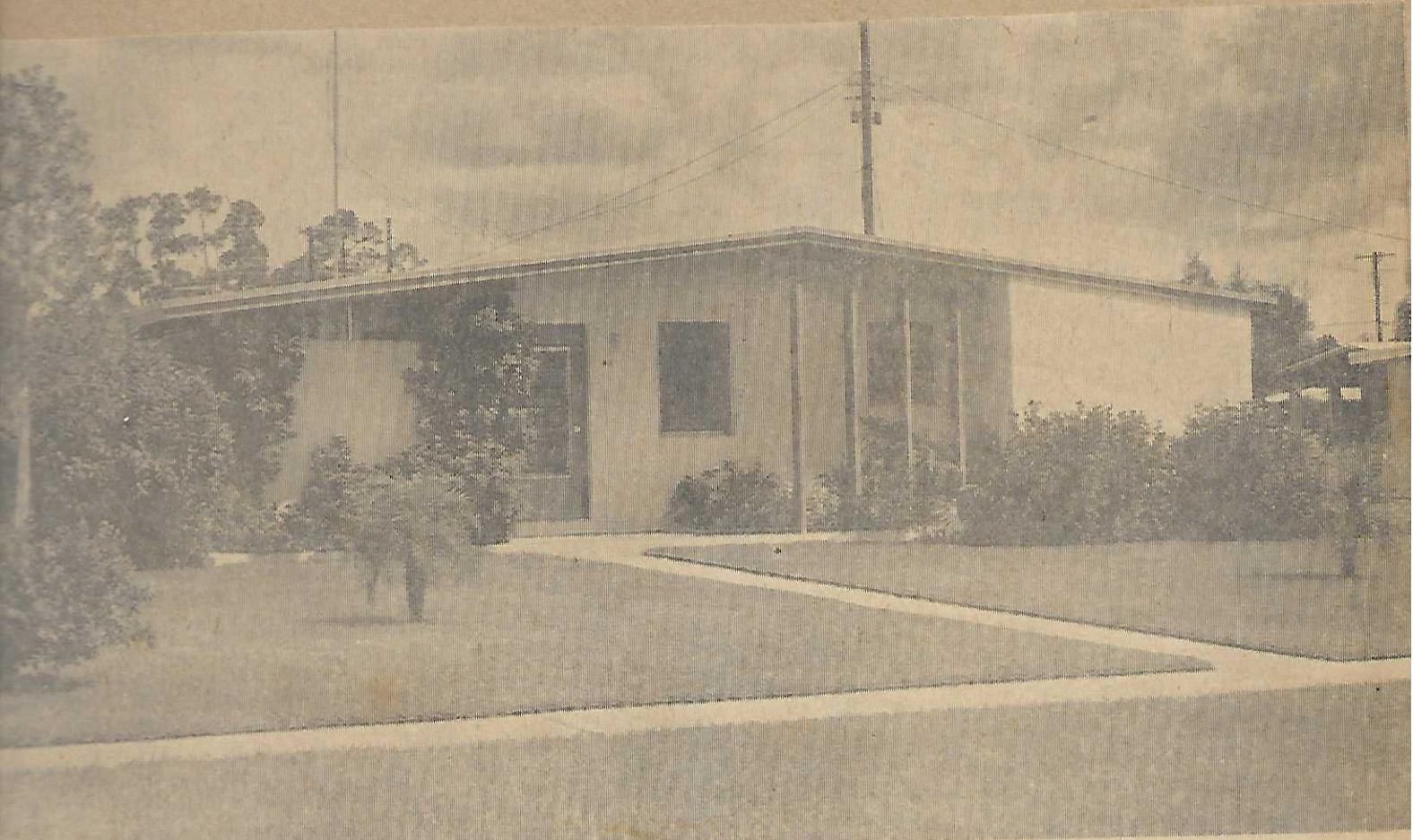
